Just over two miles from the city centre, Jubilee Campus, home to the School of Computer Science, has first-rate academic and social facilities – set in beautifully landscaped, environmentally friendly grounds.

The Campus hosts a number of other schools, institutes and centres and has its own accommodation, libraries, food outlets, shops and bank. It is a lively, diverse community close to local amenities and popular student haunts, with easy access to University Park and the city centre.

With the addition of the Innovation Park, the Campus continues to evolve. To celebrate the University's continuing growth, *Aspire*, the country's tallest free-standing work of public art, spirals to an awe-inspiring 60 metres above the Campus.

Life for computer science students on Jubilee Campus revolves around three adjacent buildings: the Djanogly Learning Resource Centre, The Exchange and, of course, the School of Computer Science.

The Djanogly Learning Resource Centre contains materials for students within the School of Computer Science as well as the School of Education. Its novel corkscrew design creates a light, airy working environment. In addition to a range of print and electronic publications, the library provides 24 hour computer facilities, as well as an assistive technology room, and group and silent study areas.

There are additional computer rooms in The Exchange as well as a lecture theatre and seminar rooms. The bustling ground floor also has a cafe, the Students' Union Shop, a bank, and bookshop.

Adjoining the School of Computer Science is The Atrium – the main food outlet on campus. Its pleasant view across the lake, combined with the space and light created by its soaring glass walls, gives the impression of dining al fresco all year round. From a full breakfast menu, to hot meals and snacks at lunch time and in the evening, refuelling during the day couldn't be simpler.

If you enjoy a physical as well as an intellectual workout, Jubilee Campus has its own sports centre, comprising facilities for basketball, tennis, netball, badminton, and squash as well as a practice room suitable for martial arts, table-tennis, aerobics, and keep fit classes. The Sports Centre's fitness suite provides access to state-of-the-art cardiovascular and strength equipment as well as an area for free weight and stretch exercises.

## Consider yourself at home

Postgraduates have a great choice of University-arranged self-catered accommodation. Situated at the northern end of Jubilee, Melton Hall commands a superb view across the lake and Campus, and Raleigh Park is just a short walk away in nearby Lenton, a popular student area. Accommodation for postgraduates is also available at St. Peter's Court in Radford, Albion House and Broadgate Park in Beeston, and Cloister House in Dunkirk.

## Green credentials

Over the years, the University has worked hard to improve its environmental credentials and has received a number of awards recognising its green practices, particularly at Jubilee Campus. Situated on land that previously had industrial use, it is beautifully landscaped around a series of lakes that not only form part of the Campus' cooling system, but also provide a city centre habitat for a variety of wildlife. The purpose-built facilities make use of a number of sustainable design features including a super-efficient mechanical ventilation system and lighting sensors to reduce energy consumption. Even the roofs are, quite literally, green – carpeted with alpine plants to maintain steady temperatures, whatever the weather.

## Travel wise

The University provides a free Hopper Bus service between University Park and Jubilee Campus. The Campus is also well served by public transport and the city centre is just a short bus ride away. The campus is criss-crossed with cycle paths and there is ample secure parking for bicycles.

## School of Computer Science facilities and resources

The School provides the latest in advanced teaching technologies and high-speed networking as well as first-rate facilities for research into automated scheduling and optimisation, mixed reality, foundations of programming, and image processing. It has three large computing labs, equipped to a high specification. Microsoft application and development suites are installed on all lab machines, and the School's rolling programme of upgrades ensures that students have access to the latest equipment and software. A dedicated team of support staff works within the School – experienced not only in the latest technologies, but also the demands of research within this field.
